#### KS3

##### Kindness Challenge

Students who sign up to this find an uplifting/motivational/kind/thoughtful/comforting quotation from a book, or several quotations from several books. These can be books currently being read, books from childhood, even books their parents are reading. Write one quotation on a post-it or small square sheet of paper (quotation, book, author). Decorate or illustrate as appropriate, in any medium. Leave the note somewhere in the community for others to find and find joy in. It would be nice if it's signed (*student, year, Malmesbury School*) unless you want to be anonymously kind and uplifting!

##### World Book Day (in a month's time!!)

It's a bit virtual this year like everything else! Students who sign up to this could:

- Take part in a day's Readathon. Submit number of books/chapters/pages read to your English teacher/tutor

- Draw up a 'Book Bucket List' of books you would like to read

#### KS4 /Year 10

- Based on the poems (or a favourite one) you've been working on this term, design a Poetry Scrapbook. This would be a page devoted to the imagery, themes and ideas from one poem. It can take any form e.g. collage, illustration, quotations etc. See Powerpoint for further instructions...
- Make a 'guess the poem/quotation' quiz using artistic abilities and/or any household items you can find to photograph and represent an image/phrase/line from the poem. Make sure you send these in!
- Look back through the poems you've studied this term and create a pie chart of the different emotions represented i.e. collect up words that represent different emotions and represent them in a chart
- Draw a historical timeline or map of texts you've studied this year
- Storyboard (drawing or photography) a film trailer for an adaptation of the poem or non-fiction text/extract you've liked the best this term
