# HART Prize for Human Rights

The HART Prize for Human Rights is a competition for young people who are interested in global issues. The aims of the competition are to raise awareness of conflict, poverty and human rights abuses amongst young people in the UK, particularly situations which are underrepresented in the mainstream media.

There are two ways to take part in this competition.

Essay titles you might want to answer:

1. Explain Human Rights and freedom as you understand it. How do you think it is different from how another child in a developing country would see it? Refer to one or more of the countries who HART work with.
2. In your mind, what does it mean for a country to be developed? Refer to one or more of the countries who HART work with.
3. You have been granted one hour to discuss one of the countries in which HART works with Prime Minister Boris Johnson. What would be the key human rights issue you would discuss?
4. Timor-Leste has one of the highest childhood malnutrition rates in the world. Describe what you think life might be like if you had to struggle to find food every day.

### The challenge... get critical!

Write an **essay** about the political, humanitarian and human rights issues facing those living in one or more of the countries in which HART works.

### Requirements

The junior and intermediate essays must be no more than 800 words. No referencing is required.

### The challenge... get creative!

Produce a **creative** piece of work about the humanitarian situation in any of the countries in which HART works, or on the main themes connecting them, e.g. recent conflict, aid, human rights atrocities. Research something about one or more of these countries that grabs your attention, and use your imagination to bring it to life in a creative way.
