Doctors Live – anatomy club 3-month programme (NOT FREE £59 per student)

The **Anatomy Club** is a 3-month after-school programme covering all 12 organ systems. The sessions run for 2 hours weekly, every Tuesday evening, led by two practising doctors. We cover the body systems in a fun and interactive manner by dissecting our virtual anatomy model. We also cover diseases affecting the organ system and try to solve anonymised real-life patient cases together.

The sessions are aimed at any students interested in Science and Healthcare who want to learn something outside of the school curriculum. Our passion is to inspire students to learn about human science in an engaging and affordable manner. The course suits all students aged 13 and above. Certificates will be provided for participation. Once registered, students will be emailed links to their virtual work experience portals.

Students are awarded a Work Experience Certificate for every session they complete. Those who complete the full 5-month programme will be awarded a Highly Commended Reference from the Presidents of Allied Healthcare Mentor. These are

fantastic additions to their CVs and UCAS applications!

This programme is suitable for students in years 10 - 13 who are interested in the following careers:

- Nursing
- Midwifery
- Paramedicine
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Dietetics
- Radiography
- Prosthetics and Orthotics
- Speech and Language Therapy
- Pharmacy

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. They will gain a unique insight into how patients interact with a variety of healthcare professionals and what it's like to work in an NHS multidisciplinary team.

Attendees will have the opportunity to interact with healthcare professionals throughout each day. This will empower students to make an informed career decision and demonstrate their commitment to healthcare in their UCAS applications.

This taster day will allow you to experience a comprehensive insight into the field of Occupational Therapy at a university level. Engage with key concepts developed by our academic staff as you learn and navigate our diverse modules, explore various career paths and uncover opportunities in the field, all through an interactive lens.

On our Occupational Therapy course, you'll gain an understanding of how to help people overcome daily challenges. With your vision, you'll be able to help people achieve and progress in their everyday lives and help them improve their quality of life. You'll meet people from around the world who share your values and can broaden your perspective on looking after others. You'll also take part in a supervised practice placement each year. This gives you opportunities to apply everything you learn on the course in a professional context. Placements take place in or outside of the Oxford area, in professional settings, giving you the chance to learn and practice on location. This degree is approved by the Health and Care Professions Council. It is accredited by the Royal College of Occupational Therapists. Successful completion allows you to register as an occupational therapist in the UK. So you can be confident you'll be learning the right skills for a lifelong and rewarding career.

If you would like to book onto the Occupational Therapy taster session taking place at the Marston Campus on May 1st, 2024, there are still places available.

The taster days give students the chance to:

Applications to College, Sixth Forms and Apprenticeships - Year 11

How and when to apply?

For any students who have not yet applied to college, applications can still be made online via the college websites. Whilst most colleges do not have a set deadline, the preference is for applications to be made as early as possible in year 11 to allow for interviews to take place before Easter.

Please note – Cirencester College have now introduced an application deadline of the 31st of July 2024. Applications after this date will not be processed until previous applicants have been allocated courses. For any students considering applying to Cirencester College, I would recommend doing so as soon as possible.

Year 11 students can apply to as many colleges as they wish and make a final decision after GCSE results if needs be.

Students who wish to apply to a sixth form need to check with the sixth form directly to find out when they will be accepting applications. Many sixth forms will have an application window that opens after their open day has taken place.

Apprenticeships information for year 11, and 13

Year 11 Students wishing to apply for apprenticeships who do not have an employer should follow these steps:

- 1) Apply to colleges/training providers as soon as possible for full time courses as a back-up plan as well as apprenticeship courses. Colleges/training providers will do their best to match apprentices with employers. Colleges locally providing apprenticeships include: Cirencester, Bath, Wiltshire, South Gloucestershire & Stroud and New College Swindon.
- 2) Create an account and set up vacancy alerts on: <u>Find an apprenticeship GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>

 Most vacancies for year 11 leavers will be advertised from Spring however
 - some larger firms will recruit from the Autumn term.
- 3) Contact local businesses of interest sending a CV and a speculative letter you might get in touch just before they advertise!

For those students with an employer lined up, their employer should be able to direct them to the appropriate college or training provider. However, if the employer isn't sure, please speak to Sarah Griffin – careers adviser for advice.

Year 13 Students wishing to apply for apprenticeships should follow these steps:

- 1) Create an account and set up vacancy alerts on: <u>Find an apprenticeship GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u> (you can select higher and degree apprenticeship vacancies only) Apprenticeships can be advertised at any point in the year but many vacancies for year 13 leavers will be advertised from the Autumn term
- 2) Register for alerts and search on UCAS via their two search options: <u>Degree</u> jobs (ucas.com) and <u>Search (ucas.com)</u>
- 3) Some higher and degree apprenticeships will also be advertised via: NGTU Job Search (notgoingtouni.co.uk)
- 4) Consider your back up plan if you're not successful finding an apprenticeship this year what else could you do? A Gap year, an entry level job, go to university? Many students apply to UCAS for a degree and also apply to apprenticeship vacancies alongside keeping more doors open for longer.




